It opened at 7 o'clock.; 13 Eric wanted to know when Kate had been there last.; 14 Kate thought it had been a year or so before. She wanted to know why Eric had smiled when he had asked the question.; 15 Eric told her that there was now a big supermarket there / where the café used to be. He advised Kate to make sandwiches.
