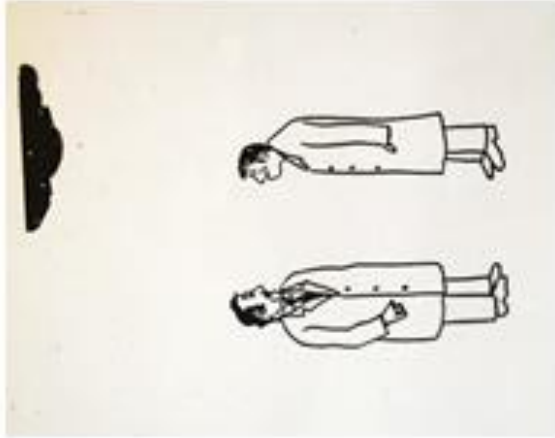

While they were talking,

(long action)

it began to rain.

(new action → happened suddenly)


longer action: Past Progressive

new action: Simple Past

SIMPLE PAST AND PAST PROGRESSIVE

AB

While Mrs Foster **was taking** the dog for a walk, Mr Foster **was reading** the newspaper when the telephone **rang**. it **started** to rain.



Handlung, die in der Vergangenheit gerade ablief

neue Handlung, die in der Vergangenheit begann

Das **past progressive** beschreibt oft eine Handlung, die gerade ablief, als eine zweite Handlung einsetzte. Die **neu hinzukommende Handlung** steht im **simple past**.



While Mrs Foster **was taking** the dog for a walk, it **started** to rain.



Mr Foster **was reading** the newspaper, when the telephone **rang**.
