### THE HISTORY OF CHICAGO



In **1673** two men from France discovered a place called Chicagou near Lake Michigan.



► Chicago's population got bigger and bigger. By **1837** Chicago had 4,000 inhabitants and became a city.



► The world's first skyscraper was built after the Great Chicago Fire. The building opened in **1884**.



► In **1871** there was a great fire. 100,000 people lost their homes and about 300 people died.



► Municipal Pier opened in **1916**. The pier was for ships, but it had a small amusement park too. Today the pier is called Navy Pier.



► In **1973** the Willis Tower opened. It was the tallest building in the USA until 2013. You can see four states (Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin) from the top.



► A great meeting place for the people from Chicago and tourists opened in **2004**: Millennium Park.



► In **2016** the people of Chicago celebrated 100 years since Navy Pier opened.

# The will-future

## I. Positive statements

It **will be** sunny tomorrow.

It **will snow** in the mountains.

→ **will** + **infinitive**

## II. Negative statements

It **won't rain** tomorrow.

It **won't be** foggy in the morning.

→ **won't (will not)** + **infinitive**

## III. Questions

**Will** the fog **clear**?

**Will** the weather **be** fine tomorrow?

Yes, it **will**.

No, it **won't**.

We use the will-future for things we can't plan.
