The Skye Museum of Island Life

At the Skye Museum of Island Life you can go back in time more than a hundred years. In an old Highland village visitors can see how people lived and worked on the Isle of Skye in the 19th century.

In the past life was very different from today. People worked outdoors most of the time. A lot of people were farmers. Many of them had sheep or cows, which gave them wool or meat. They lived in little houses and didn't own very much. Their houses were made of materials like stone or wood, which people found on the island. During the long winter evenings people sat together around a fire, talking and enjoying stories and music.

To modern visitors the old Highland houses may look simple and not very comfortable. But they were a warm and safe place for the island people of that time.

The museum at Kilmuir opened in 1965. Today you can visit old Scottish houses there and look at different rooms like the kitchen, the bedroom and the workshops. All the old tables and chairs, tools, instruments and other things there can tell you a lot about people's everyday lives a hundred years ago.
